



Dr. Öngür obtained his M.D./Ph.D. degree from Washington University in St.Louis in 2000. For his Ph.D. work, Dr. Öngür studied the neuroanatomy of the prefrontal cortex. Dr. Öngür completed his psychiatric residency training at the MGH/McLean Adult Psychiatry program in Boston, Massachusetts. He is currently the Chief of the Psychotic Disorders Division, responsible for 2 inpatient units, a residential facility, and a specialty outpatient clinic. In addition to his clinical work, he receives funding from the National Institute of Mental Health for his research using brain imaging techniques to study chemical abnormalities in patients with schizophrenia and bipolar disorder. He is currently an Associate Professor of Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School and the author of more than 70 articles on research into the neurobiology of bipolar disorder and schizophrenia. He has won awards from the Harvard Medical School for his teaching and mentoring work, and is the Associate Editor of JAMA Psychiatry, a premier journal in the field.
